The 67 injuries described above have 2 things in common:

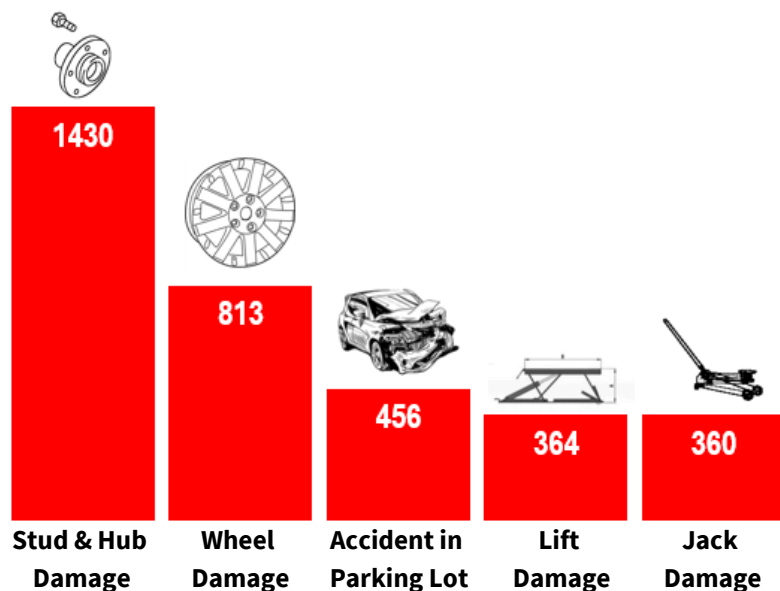
#1 The Best Practice was not followed

VEHICLE DAMAGE TRENDS | OUR CUSTOMERS

DAMAGE CLAIM COUNT 2021



Stud & Hub Damage

- Talk to customer before removing cross-threaded lug nuts
- Minimum of 3 turns by hand. Do more if needed

Wheel Damage

- Talk to customer in the parking lot about damaged wheels
- Always use adjustment knob on changer

Accident in Parking Lot

- Stop if you can't see your guide
- SLOW DOWN!

Jack & Lift Damage

- Always look under before raising
- Avoid pinch welds, they bend really easy
- Go very slow pulling in and out over the lift
- Test stability after raising every time

Extreme Temperatures

With the extreme high temperatures and as we continue to go through the summer months, we need to be informed on how to stay safe and what to do if anyone experience heat stress. Extreme heat is defined as summertime temperatures that are much hotter and/or humid than average. Because some places are hotter than others, this depends on what's considered average for a particular location at that time of year. Humid and muggy conditions can make it seem hotter than it really is.

Take Control of Heat Stress

Help reduce workplace heat stress by asking yourself:

- ✓ Are the fans in my store/location in good working condition?
- ✓ Is there a cool area for my people to take breaks?
- ✓ Am I rotating personnel who are doing inventory all day?
 - Rotate employees every 30 minutes
- ✓ Am I switching out personnel doing air checks throughout the day?
 - Rotate employees every 30 minutes
- ✓ Have I implemented a buddy system at my store/location?
 - Observe each other for signs of heat intolerance
- ✓ Have I provided adequate amounts of cool drinking water for my people?
 - Encourage workers to drink frequently
- ✓ Are the "Are You Hydrated" posters hung up in each of your restrooms?
 - Use the poster to gauge your hydration
- ✓ Have you ordered cooling towels for your people?

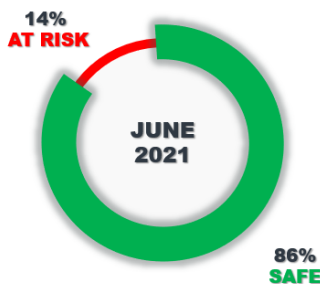

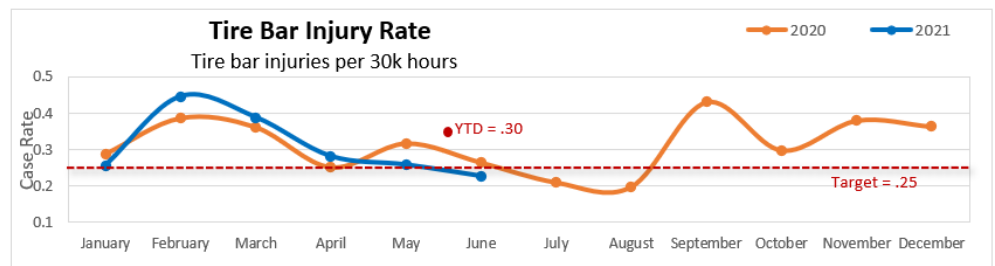
