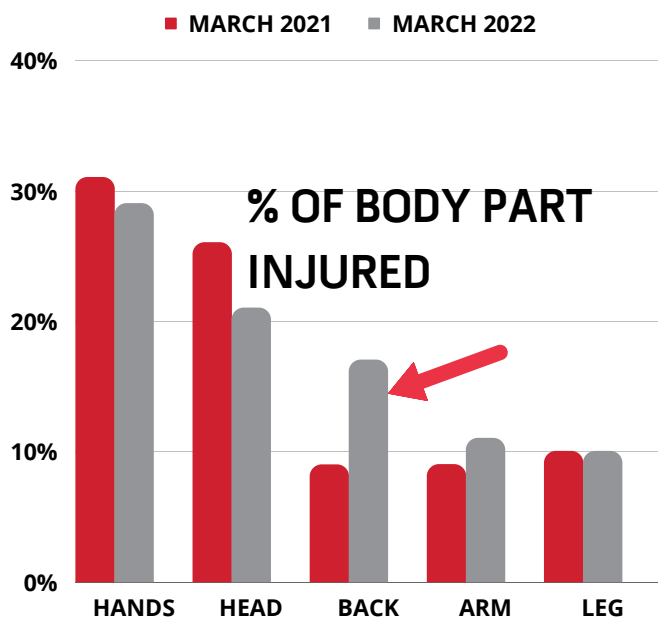

Back injuries

As you can see in the chart, we made some nice improvements in hand and head injuries in March 2022 compared to March 2021.

The body part that had the highest percentage of injury compared to last year was the back!

Overexertion Injuries

While proper lifting technique is critical to preventing back injuries (lift with your knees, don't twist etc.), it is important to remember that your body has limits. If a load is too heavy, proper lifting technique will only go so far to prevent an injury.

All of us can pretty easily tell when something is too heavy to lift without assistance. Instead of trying to lift anyway and risk injury, we challenge you to **STOP AND ASK FOR HELP**. Your back will be happy you did.

Proposed Glove Best Practice

Last month, we asked you and your team your thoughts on the proposed Glove Best Practice. Here are what some of your peers had to say:

“Our people want the choice to wear gloves, they do not want to be forced to wear gloves. The gloves provided by discount tire help slightly but they're not injury proof. Using proper body mechanics and finger placement is the best key to prevent injuries.”

“I think using gloves in the back room is a good idea having safety in mind. Most of our guys are already using gloves so they were not opposed to having them on.”

“Most of the team think it's a great idea and would prefer it to keep us as safe as possible and to reduce the amount of injuries.”

“My team wasn't too happy about having to have gloves mandatory. Most of the guys don't like to use gloves however with explanation of keeping the team safer most guys tended to be more on board.”

“Based on the feedback provided by our people, the current best practice was the preferred choice. They did like that we offer gloves and have them available throughout the year.”

“After reviewing the glove best practice with most of my team, they were mostly on board with the best practice. The proposed BP was pretty clear and does not need changed. 95% of the guys were on board with the proposed best practice, stating they already were gloves all the time. The other 5% did not like the idea, but still were on board with it.”

“After going over the best practice about the gloves the techs did not know they could remove their gloves when doing different tasks, other than using the dunk tank. They are looking forward to putting the best practice to use.”

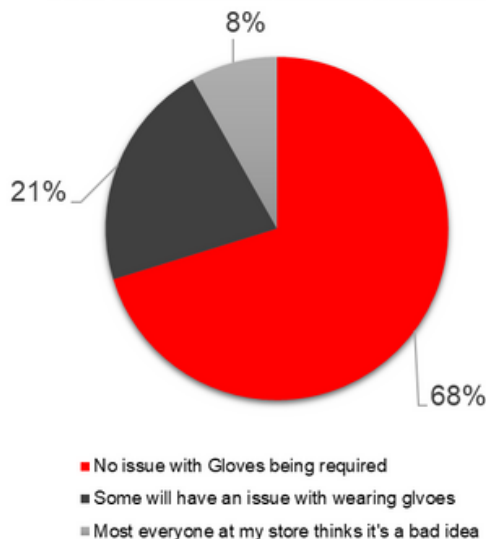

PPE BEST PRACTICE FEEDBACK

PPE-Glove Best Practice Feedback



Last month, we asked you to review and provide feedback on the proposed PPE Gloves Best Practice. Each response was read and classified into three groups.

68% of you said that you and your people thought the requirement to wear gloves would be accepted and welcomed at their store. Only 8% of you said that no one at your store liked the idea. The remaining 3% had no opinion.
