4 of Our People Suffered From Heat Illness in June 2022

Keep it Simple

Stay Hydrated

- Drink 24-32 Oz of water every hour you work.
- Being hydrated when you start work makes it easier to stay hydrated through the day.
- If you're dehydrated when you start work, you may not be able to drink enough to catch up with your body's need for water.

Avoid Energy Drinks - High caffeine levels can be risky when added to the strain placed on your body by heat.

Stop Work and Let Someone Know If You're Feeling Ill - Don't try to push through it. Sometimes a short break is all you need to start feeling better.

Pulling Vehicles Out



CRITICAL
TO SAFETY

A valid driver's license is necessary to move vehicles.

- Confirm all assemblies have been torqued and the vehicle has been lowered completely.
- When backing out, always check to see that no employees are in front of or behind the vehicle. This includes employees changing, balancing, or using the inflation cage.
- Adjust mirrors and be aware of your blind spot.
- Honk! As you back up
- Make sure the guide is standing to the side as the vehicle is being backed out.
- Stay focused on the person guiding out the vehicle, their hand signals, and drive slowly.

Heat Awareness - Preventing Heat Illness

Last month, we asked you and your team about your plan to prevent heat related illnesses/injuries.

Here are what some of your peers had to say:

“ My team is changing up the plays about every 3 hours so not everyone is in one position all day, ideally to keep them cool and not running around the whole time. ”

“ The team is using the buddy system and well as the SC making sure he is constantly passing out water to the backroom team. Gatorade on ice throughout the day for the backroom team. ”

“ Rotating guys on air checks to limit time in the heat. **Every 30 minutes we have them come in to cool off by the fans or A/C.** We have also grabbed a cooler with ice for cool towels and sports drinks. ”

“ In order to stay safe during the summer months we are ensuring everyone has a water bottle available to them and take breaks when possible to cool down. ”

“ My main focus with my crew for hydrations has been making the guys aware of the side effects of drinking pop or energy drinks before or even at night. ”

“ This month we have precautions set in place to prevent heat related injuries to our people. To begin we made sure our **water fountain is functioning properly and the fridges were stocked with water.** We have a cool break room and covered bays if our people need to cool off and take a break. ”

“ **Stay hydrated as much as possible.** Ice water will be provided as much as possible and a plan for cooling towels is being implemented. Working with our workflow ensuring no one tech works harder than another. ”

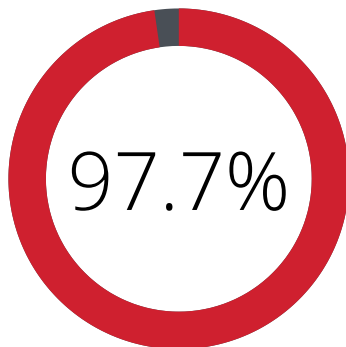

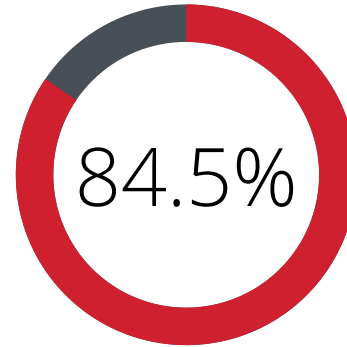
JUNE OBSERVATION RESULTS
