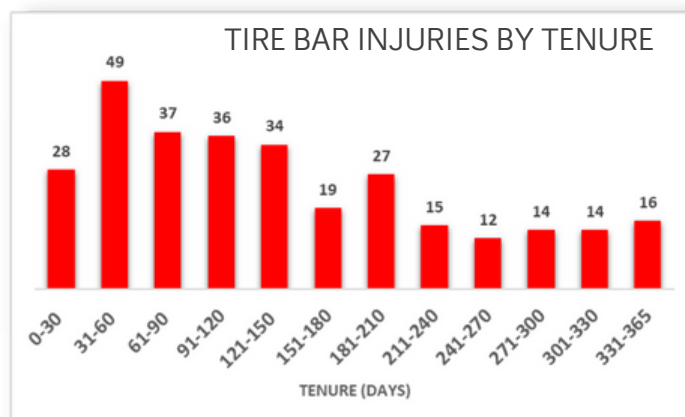
OUR PEOPLE

NEWEST EMPLOYEES AT HIGHER RISK FOR TIRE BAR INJURIES

As you can see in the chart to the right, **employees that have worked for us for 31-60 days are at highest risk for a tire bar injury**. This trend continues through the 180 day mark.

While this information may not be surprising to you, **take a moment to reflect on what you are doing today to protect your newest employees from injury**. Here's some things you should be doing, especially for your new people

1. Conduct observations (go see) to confirm Best Practices are being executed every time
2. Use positive reinforcement when you see your people doing it right
3. Stop and coach if you see issues with BP execution

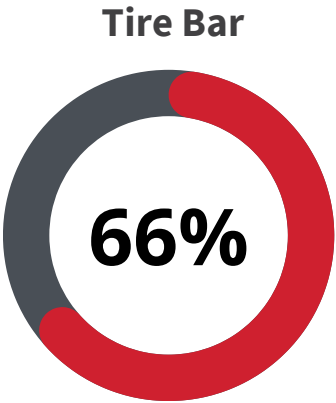
