

0 OSHA RECORDABLE TIRE BAR INJURIES IN FEBRUARY

Compared to 2022, our [tire bar injury rate](#) is down **.04** per 30k hours [worked](#). Nearly all tire bar incidents that happened in February involved the bar "slipping" or the employee "losing grip" Of the 14 injuries that occurred in February, the average tenure was 360 days, with [5 in their first 60 days of work](#). There's no doubt that newer employees are at higher risk for injury. Here are a few reminders to keep this trending in the right direction.

1. **Keep your bars freshly taped**
2. **Keep a good grip on the tire bar**
3. **Stand back away from the assembly**
4. **Stand at 6 o'clock**
5. **Continue observing (especially new people)**


