

REQUIREMENTS FOR DRIVERS & VEHICLES

DRIVERS & VEHICLES

- 1) Each driver needs an ELD Device login & password
- 2) Each driver needs to understand how to log into the ELD at the beginning of the shift and log out of the device at the end of the shift
- 3) Each driver needs to understand how to Select and Release the vehicle they will operate
- 4) Each vehicle needs a mounting device (in view of the driver) for the cell phone used as the ELD Device
- 5) Each driver needs to understand that their cell phone must be mounted in a mounting device (in view of the driver) while the vehicle is in motion
- 6) Each driver needs to understand the Driver Statuses and applicable Hours of Service
 - a. Driver Statuses
 - i. Off Duty
 - ii. Sleeper Berth
 - iii. Driving
 - iv. On Duty Not Driving
 - b. Hours of Service
 - i. 11-Hour Rule
 - ii. ½-Hour Break Rule
 - iii. 14-Hour Rule
 - iv. 60-Hour Rule
- 7) Each driver needs to understand how to enter comments and annotations for certain Driver Statuses
- 8) Each driver needs to understand how to edit the ELD Record if errors are recorded
- 9) Each driver needs to understand that Unidentified Driving Records (UDRs) will be created if the vehicle is driven without a driver logged in and how to accept or reject a UDR if sent to their device
- 10) Each vehicle must possess the following items:
 - a. Emergency Triangles
 - b. Fire Extinguisher
 - c. Spare fuses for necessary vehicle equipment

ADMINISTRATIVE

- 1) Each driver needs an ELD Device login & password (including profile setup with name, Drivers License information – DLN or SSN cannot be part of driver's login)
- 2) Each vehicle needs a mounting device (in view of the driver) for the cell phone used as the ELD Device
- 3) Each vehicle must possess the following items:
 - a. Emergency Triangles
 - b. Fire Extinguisher
 - c. Spare fuses for necessary vehicle equipment
 - d. ELD Device User Manual
 - e. ELD Device Malfunction Explanation Sheet
 - f. ELD Quick Reference Guide
 - g. ELD Device Inspection Instructions, including how to complete a Data Transfer
 - i. Web Services Data Transfer
 - ii. Email Data Transfer
 - h. 8 Blank Paper Logbook Pages
