

<b>Purpose</b>	To be able to properly and safely lift Rivian vehicles.


**Using the  
Rivian Jack  
Adapter**

Follow these steps when lifting Rivian vehicles:

Step	Action	
1	Reference the CSL to verify the vehicle will need a jack adapter.	
2	Collect the lift adapters and stage them on the tool stand prior to pulling the vehicle into the bay.  <b>Note:</b> Only use flat bays and jacks with pads to service the vehicle.	
3	Once the vehicle has been pulled into the bay, put the vehicle into the highest ride height setting by following these steps: <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Go to <b>Drive Modes</b> in the center display</li><li>2. Select <b>Off-Road All-Terrain</b></li><li>3. Then select <b>Highest</b> under <b>Ride Height</b>.</li></ol>	
4	Ensure the automatic suspension adjustments are disabled by following these steps: <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Go to <b>Settings</b> in the center display.</li><li>2. Select <b>Vehicle</b>.</li><li>3. Then select <b>Service</b>.</li><li>4. Turn on <b>Tire Change</b> mode.</li></ol>	
5	Locate the proper lift points on the undercarriage of the vehicle.

## Using the Rivian Jack Adapter

Step	Action	
6	Remove the protective cover by applying force to the inner edge.	
7	Place the adapter in the appropriate lift point.  <b>Note:</b> If there is debris in the lift point, please remove/clean before inserting adapter; this increases the longevity of the O-ring.	
8	Center jack pad under the adapter and begin to raise vehicle.	
9	Repeat Steps 6 through 9 for the remaining lift points.	
 <b>CRITICAL TO SAFETY</b>		When servicing four new tires, lift one side of the vehicle at a time (two people recommended) to ensure even weight distribution.  Never enter the zone beneath a lifted vehicle.
10	Once the service has been completed, lower the vehicle, remove the adapters, and return them to their proper storage location.	
11	Before pulling the vehicle out of the bay, turn off <b>Tire Change</b> mode and return the vehicle to the standard ride height by following these steps: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Go to <b>Drive Modes</b>  in the center display.</li> <li>2. Select <b>All-Purpose</b> .</li> <li>3. Then select <b>Standard</b> under <b>Ride Height</b>.</li> </ol>
